Technology Acceptable Use Policy

VisionWay Christian School

Part of the Mission of VisionWay Christian School is to ensure that all students develop technology skills for life-long learning. Student internet and technology use within or school is for educational purposes only. In addition, students are expected to be good digital citizens and follow these guidelines for acceptable use of the internet.

Students:

- I will use technology resources in a responsible, ethical, and legal manner. I will use technology resources only for school-related purposes.
- I will not access, modify, or destroy other user's data. I will not knowingly spread a computer virus, impersonate another user, violate copyright laws, install or use unauthorized software, damage or destroy resources, or intentionally offend, harass or intimidate others.
- I will access the Internet only under appropriate supervision. I will only view sites that directly pertain to a school-related assignment. I will not use school technology resources to create, distribute, download, or view obscene, illegal, or inappropriate content.
- I will not plagiarize from the internet.
- I will immediately inform a staff member if I encounter material that is obscene, illegal, inappropriate, offensive, or otherwise makes me feel uncomfortable.
- I will use electronic mail responsibly and only through an authorized class account. I will not create, distribute or forward chain letters, offensive messages, harassing messages, or messages that contain false information. I will distribute copyrighted material only if I have the owner's written permission.
- I will not give out my password.
- I will immediately notify a staff member or school administrator if I am the subject of harassment while using technology resources or if I witness inappropriate use of technology resources.

Parents:

- Students will be issued an individual account through Google Apps for Education. The
 administration will maintain security of the password and teachers will directly supervise
 individual student use of that account.
- In addition, because the internet can help teachers and students foster connections with people in the community and around the world, video conferencing may be used in our school for benefits including expanding the learning that occurs in the classroom. Utilizing these modes of communication voice, text, and video—also provide students the opportunity to experience learning through different media.
